

## East Barrier Bar Broadcast

As reported by Lindsey Gerstenlager, District Manager for Wayne County Water and Soil in late November, 2017, the East Barrier Bar Project continues to move forward.

The Port Bay East Barrier Bar is owned by New York State, which means NYS Dept. of State (NYSDOS) holds the responsibility of ownership. NYS Dept. of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) manages the property as a Fishing Access Site (FAS) and maintains the property in relationship with the approval of NYSDOS.

A workgroup was initially created in 2015 with representatives from local leadership of the PBIA, Town of Wolcott, Town of Huron, NYS Sea Grant, NYSDEC Region 8 and Wayne County Soil and Water Conservation District. Through environmental impact studies, research, geographical and accountability surveys, stabilization tests, data analysis and consistent monitoring, this group has identified many potential shoreline stabilization applications to restore the integrity of the East Barrier Bar and maintain a living shoreline.

A report will be published this Spring outlining the internal planning of this working group. The PBIA is committed to a continued partnership with the Wayne County Soil and Water Conservation District, local town governments, and New York State. This has been, and continues to be, a long and arduous process. The PBIA Board appreciates the memberships continued support and will continue to need your help in advocating for a permanent solution.

## **Sewer System Summary**

The Port Bay sewer project continues to move forward. The project was sent out for BID. Currently the Town of Wolcott, Town of Huron, MRB Group and the both Town attorneys are working to finalize this process. It is expected that the project will be awarded to the contractor in late February. Work on the project will begin in the Spring as weather permits.
